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Code of Conduct Policy

Objective

To establish standards of professional behavior, ethical practice, and discipline for all students at The Scholars College of Nursing and Health Sciences.

Scope

This policy applies to all students enrolled in academic and clinical programs at The Scholars College of Nursing and Health Sciences.

1. Professional Behavior

- Students are expected to maintain honesty, integrity, and professionalism in all academic and clinical activities.
- Respect towards faculty, staff, peers, and patients is mandatory at all times.
- Students must refrain from any behavior that may damage the college's reputation.

2. Attendance and Punctuality

- Students must attend all classes, clinical sessions, and college activities as per the Attendance Policy.
- Punctuality is expected for lectures, clinical rounds, and examinations.



3. Dress Code

- Official uniform must be worn during classes, clinical training, and official college events.
- Personal grooming and hygiene must adhere to professional standards.
